50% OF FARM TO WORKERS

» Grain SA has taken note of Minister Nkwini's proposal to give 50% of each farm to the farmworkers. This is the second time the proposal has been made. Grain SA is totally against such a proposal! Following the Minister tabling the proposal, Grain SA consulted with Advocate George Bizos to obtain his opinion on the matter. He was of the opinion that such a proposal would be unconstitutional and that the ANC would probably not garner enough support in the next elections (7 May 2014) to be in a position to change the Constitution. He further advised that Grain SA should proceed to assist new Black farmers to become established as successful commercial grain farmers, and to table proposals to improve the circumstances of farm workers.

The leadership of Grain SA as such is prepared to address this matter if the Minister proceed after the elections. Even the African Farmers Association of SA (AFASA) is against this proposal. We would like to call on our members to remain calm and await the outcome of the elections. Grain SA undertakes to protect the grain farmers' rights as per the Constitution of SA, should it be affected.

THE ROLE OF TILLAGE IN SUSTAINABLE PRODUCTION ON SANDY SOIL

A Farmers' Day, themed "The role of tillage in sustainable production on sandy soil" was held on 9 April on Danie Minnaar's farm, Springboklaagte, situated near Kroonstad. The event, jointly organised by Grain SA and the "Sandgrond Ontwikkelings Komitee" (SOK) attracted a group of 85 farmers who cultivate grain crops on sandy soils. These unique soils, found mainly in the North West Free State and North West Province, typically consists of less than 10% clay with a deep water table that requires unique management practices to productively utilise it in a sustainable manner. Two of the most negative characteristics of these soils are that they tend to be easily compacted and remain very susceptible to wind and water erosion. This necessitated farmers and other experts to develop innovative conservation practices, such as the 'rip-on-row' system, in order to simultaneously provide a solution to the problems and greatly increase production.

The participants in the Farmers' Day was fortunate to hear from people who have pioneered these practices since the early 1970's. Carel Koch shared his many years of experience with participants having worked with amongst others, farmers such as Andries Botha, WH van Zyl and engineers, such as Errol Reid in order to develop these practices. Currently, the SOK is funded by the Maize Trust to continue this conservation agriculture research in sandy soils and several trials that have been established on co-workers' farms, such as those of Thabo van Zyl (Losdoorns), Cobus van der Linde (Wesselsbron) and Danie Minnaar (Springboklaagte). Following a visit to the trials at Springboklaagte, the three farmers shared their experiences and results with the audience, which was then summarised by Hendrik Smith, conservation agriculture facilitator at Grain SA. Jannie de Villiers, CEO of Grain SA shared some insight on the way forward, and concluded the proceedings.
