FUEL PRICE EXPECTATIONS FOR JULY 2015

According to the latest information from the Central Energy Fund it is expected that the price of diesel can increase on 1 July 2015 with 13 cents per litre and the price of petrol can increase with 50 cents per litre. The devaluation in the exchange rate in June can be attributed to this expected increases.

CONDITIONS IN THE CAPE IS LOOKING BETTER

»After great concern about the lack of rainfall in the Cape last month, the Swartland, Ruens- and Southern Cape regions experienced some joy with the rainfall in the beginning of this month. Furthermore, the areas received lovely follow-up rain in recent days, ranging between 15mm to 25mm which are doing wonders for crops.

With the majority of producers finished planting, there is an indication that the total hectares planted will not differ much from the previous season, however a decline in canola plantings and a slight increase in barley hectares have been noted.

Although the rain brings much joy to crop farmers, the feeding of animals remain a crisis for at least another two months. It has not rained food, and with the accompanying cold weather, grazing takes time to recover following the region's long summer. Producers, however, are optimistic at this stage about the year ahead.
